Since then, with 70% new home approvals being apartments, Sydney is clearly becoming more urban. People are choosing to live closer to work and amenities and 'the action'. This is good news but provides a new challenge for Sydney. As we double our households over the next 50 years vertical living will use 15 to 20 times less land than detached houses. We cannot sprawl so we need to go tall. The development industry is responding to this with many examples of quality development for the new urban lifestyle champions.
